2006 Annual Meeting & Awards Presentation *The Crocker House in Downtown New London*

Connecticut Main Street Center and Downtown New London hosted 150 attendees from throughout the State at CMSC's 2006 Annual Meeting and Awards Presentation. CMSC selected the beautifully restored Crocker House, winner of the 2006 Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation Award of Merit, as the site of its evening of networking and celebration.

In the midst of a late spring heat wave, New London's historic waterfront district provided a cool and beautiful evening, which began with an outdoor reception in the Garden Courtyard of The Crocker House. Staff and volunteers from Connecticut Main Street Communities were joined by state and local elected officials, professional state and municipal staff, and representatives from economic development and historic preservation. Gubernatorial candidate John DeStefano, Mayor of New Haven, made appearance at reception.

Following the reception, where attendees could spend some time catching up with each other, attendees retired to the Grand Ballroom for the program and Awards Presentation. This event has quickly become the highlight of the year for both CMSC and award-winning Connecticut Main Street Communities selected through a competitive process.

State Senator Andrea Stillman, a downtown New London business owner, welcomed the crowd. CMSC Board Chair, Keith J. Kumnick, provided an overview of the past year, thanking CMSC Board members and staff for their dedication and encouraging and congratulating all representatives from Connecticut Main Street Communities. Kumnick also expressed his gratitude to departing board

members, Andrea Pereira of LISC and Kinson Perry of AT&T, and he welcomed new directors Tim Coppage of CHFA and Tom Marano of CL&P.

Anita Mielert, Connecticut Advisor to the National Trust for Historic Preservation, presented CL&P with the 2006 National Main Street Leadership Award. Raymond Necci, President and Chief Operating Officer of CL&P, accepted the award. In accepting the award Necci stated, *"We at CL&P understand the need to make optimal use of our state's many historic town centers. Our motivation for launching Connecticut Main Street in 1995, and our commitment to sustain its work, represents a marriage of enlightened corporate self-interest with a dedication to the quality of life in our cities and towns."*

Mr. Necci joined CMSC President and CEO, John Simone in presenting the CL&P Award for Outstanding Contributions to Main Street Revitalization to The Hartford Courant for its focus on and commitment to the preservation and revitalization of Connecticut's downtowns and neighborhood commercial districts. Tom Condon, PLACE editor of the Courant, accepted the award on behalf of the newspaper.

A total of 34 awards were presented to local Main Street programs, professional staff and volunteers. As in previous years, each award recipient received a Citation from Governor M. Jodi Rell. The full list of award winners appears on page 3.

Nationally, the Main Street Approach to Downtown Revitalization™ is one of the most powerful economic development tools known. Here are the cumulative reinvestment statistics for Connecticut Main Street communities from 1996 – June, 2006:

Public Improvements	212
Net New Businesses	331
Net New Jobs	1,921
Construction Projects	1,470
Number of Volunteer Hours	157,069
Public Investment	\$223,853,383.
Private Investment	\$247,605,988.
Total Investment	\$471,459,371.

For every \$1 spent on a local Main Street Program's operating budget, \$70.39 has been reinvested into Connecticut Main Street Downtowns.
